SUMMARY

Under the patronage of H.H General Sheikh Mohammed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi and Deputy Supreme Commander of the UAE Armed Forces, ***International Security and National Resilience 2008*** -ISNR 08- commenced on the 2nd of March, 2008 at the Abu Dhabi National Exhibition Centre.

ISNR Abu Dhabi incorporates the former Security and Safety Middle East, InfoSecurity Middle East and APTS Middle East. Consolidation of these exhibitions ensures that ISNR is the key forum in the security events calendar.

Supported by the *UAE Ministry of Interior* and sponsored by *Critical National Infrastructure Authority*, ISNR achieved a total number of 147 International and national exhibitors who showcased their company profiles and services, covering a gross area of 13,464 sqm.

Featuring an international exhibition, ISNR hosted a total number of 7614 attendees that consisted of national and international visitors coming from 54 different countries. Moreover, ISNR attracted 73 delegates from 16 countries including Yemen, Lebanon, Egypt, Oman, Italy, France, Afghanistan, Bahrain, Tanzania, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, International Dignitaries – Europol, Jordan, Syria, Kuwait, Iraq and Qatar

During the high level conference, 8 key speakers tackled crucial topics concerning the industry. The conference was divided into 3 sessions and hosted a total number of 360 attendees.

Regarding ISNR's media exposure, 122 media members representing 49 media houses from UAE & London covered every aspect of the 4 days event. Moreover, ISNR achieved worldwide media coverage with main emphasis on GCC & Arab regions.

In order to expose and promote the event more extensively, Reed Exhibitions sent out 30,000 personal invitations and 2,000 VIP invitations to top notch industry experts.

Currently, Reed Exhibitions is developing the groundwork for ISNR 2010. Due to the sector's estimated growth of over 50% to reach AED 11.8 billion in 2013, the organizers are very optimistic regarding the event's further success during its 2nd edition in UAE's growing market.

According to surveys conducted by Reed Exhibitions 28.57% of the attendees rated the quality of the event as excellent. Moreover, 59% of the exhibitors have shown interest in ISNR's upcoming edition.

ISNR Abu Dhabi, ***the definitive event for Security and Resilience in the Middle East***, the only event bringing together the entire spectrum of homeland security issues under one roof. It is a unique event addressing the growing need for sophisticated equipment to counter international terrorism, to protect national borders and to respond resiliently to disasters, whether natural or the result of terrorism.

SHOW IMPRESSIONS & COMMENTS

US EXHIBITORS – GENERAL FEEDBACK

The overall feedback from the exhibitors was that the show was impressive – especially for a launch event. Attendee traffic, although not as high as many as exhibitors were hoping, was full of the high quality visitors that Reed Exhibitions had promised would be there. The organization of the event on-site was strong and signage for registration, onsite vendors and the organizer's office was clear and highly visible. In speaking with the exhibitors most of their issues were in regards to the lead up to the event (see below) and once the show opened there were only the minor issues that happen at every show. However, in speaking with the exhibitors upon their return from the event many feel that the show should be shortened to a 3 day event in the future as the last 1 ½ days were very quite and unnecessary

UK EXHIBITORS – GENERAL FEEDBACK

The inaugural ISNR Abu Dhabi was considered a success by almost all of the UK exhibitors. The show was a professional looking, well run event, and while visitor numbers could have been higher, the quality was good. The large presence of delegates from across the region was very important for the shows credibility, as was the number of international exhibitors.

Exhibitors were impressed with the quality of the visitors, who were of a very high standard from across the region. All UK exhibitors appreciated that we had in large part achieved what we set out to do in providing a quality, business-only audience. The main complaint was that the show was usually quite quiet, and at times very quiet. Everyone was in favour of the no-public policy however, and many pointed out that they would rather have a quiet day with several top quality meetings than be busy all day with time wasters.

FRENCH EXHIBITORS – GENERAL FEEDBACK

Good show, well organized and visitors of quality

GERMAN EXHIBITORS – GENERAL FEEDBACK

ISNR Abu Dhabi is a very good exhibition for German Companies and a great opportunity to join the middle-east Security market. ISNR Abu Dhabi will be a quick growing exhibition and extend their awareness level very fast. The Market is very interesting for German and Austrian Exhibitors.

The German Exhibitors were happy about the show. Not about the number of visitors, but about the quality of visitors. We had a very good contact to a German Association. They think about to apply the governmental funding for the next edition. This will make a strong support to our Selling's. Because of the show we stay in constant touch with an Austrian association now. Maybe there can be the possibility for a financial support. ISNR Abu Dhabi is because of their visitors a good entry for German and Austrian Companies to the Middle East Security market. We must improve our communication and co-operation to avoid confusing exhibitors and to react quicker on prospects desires.

EXHIBITORS' OPINION

CAE aviation: Good show. Especially from one official delegation. Also good contacts for local representation. Good organization.

SAGEM: Good show but not a lot of unexpected visitors. They met the minister and nobody else. Good organization. They have to be there because of their customers.

PRO ENGIN: Good show.

THALES: Good show but many problems happened:

Catering: not very professional and personnel did not speak English very well. Wrong orders every day.

Electricity: did not get electricity at the beginning. They had to pay twice because supplier could not find their bills.

German Exhibitors: All Exhibitors were happy about the show, 2 of them announced to exhibit in 2010 again, and because of their success, 2 new German Companies are thinking about exhibiting in 2010.

Aigis Blast Protection: They were at the show to meet Abu Dhabi Airport Company, which they did on the second day, so they were happy. Impressed with the additional leads they made. Their stand was busy and they were well prepared so no issues with build-up or logistics.

Allen Vanguard: They were happy with the show and they had a very good second day. Impressed with the new leads they had made for the region. Will most likely return in 2010.

De La Rue: They had been asked to exhibit by the British Council in Abu Dhabi as they had just secured a deal to print the UAE passports, so their presence was more of a PR mission than to meet new leads. However, they had a good show and may have generated some new business. They usually do more specific Document Identification shows, so ISNR was a first for them but they were happy.

Global Armor: Had a relatively quiet show, but they met some very good leads and they were impressed with the level of visitors. Their Middle East representative was on their stand and this certainly helped, along with a good location and stand layout. Will return in 2010.

Norbain: They had a very quiet show and one of their agents onsite felt that the show wasn't really for them as it was too governmental and they didn't reach the more mainstream security market they were hoping to. Unlikely to return in 2010.

Raytheon: All of the groups on their stand were pleased and the feeling is that there are most likely additional groups that would be interested in joining them for 2010.

Decision Science Corps: Overall they were very pleased with the event. ISNR was the first international trade show that they had participated in and are very likely to return in 2010. They were not impressed with the number of visitors although they were happy with the quality of the people that they met with. They were not happy with the delegation program and did not receive any delegations during the show.

Duos Technologies: Great show. According to their president Stephanie Jason they did Intersec earlier in the year and although they saw more attendees there the quality of the ISNR attendees was far superior. They will return to ISNR in 2010 with a similar sized stand.

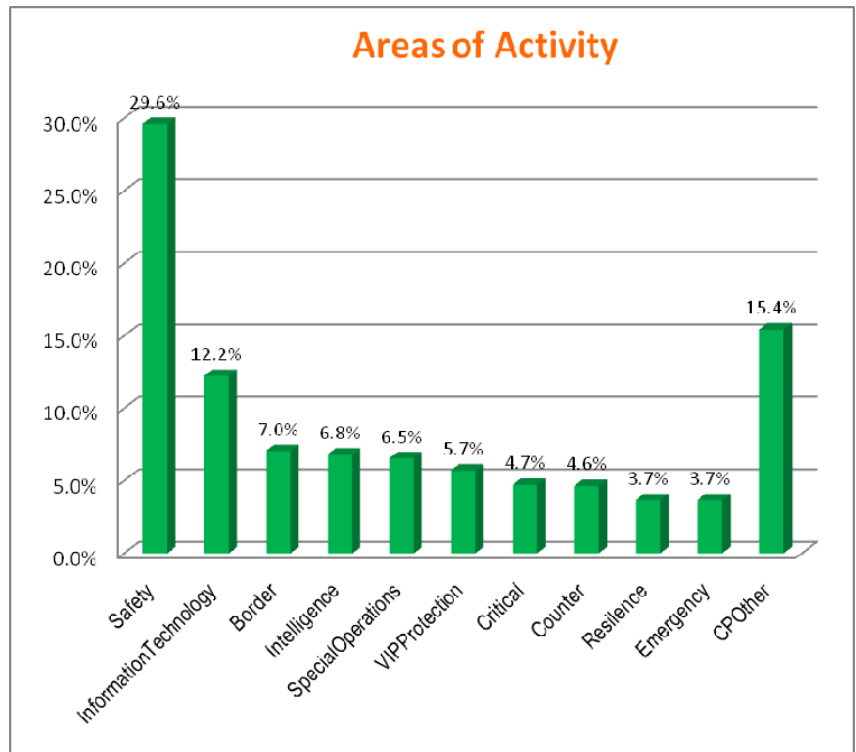

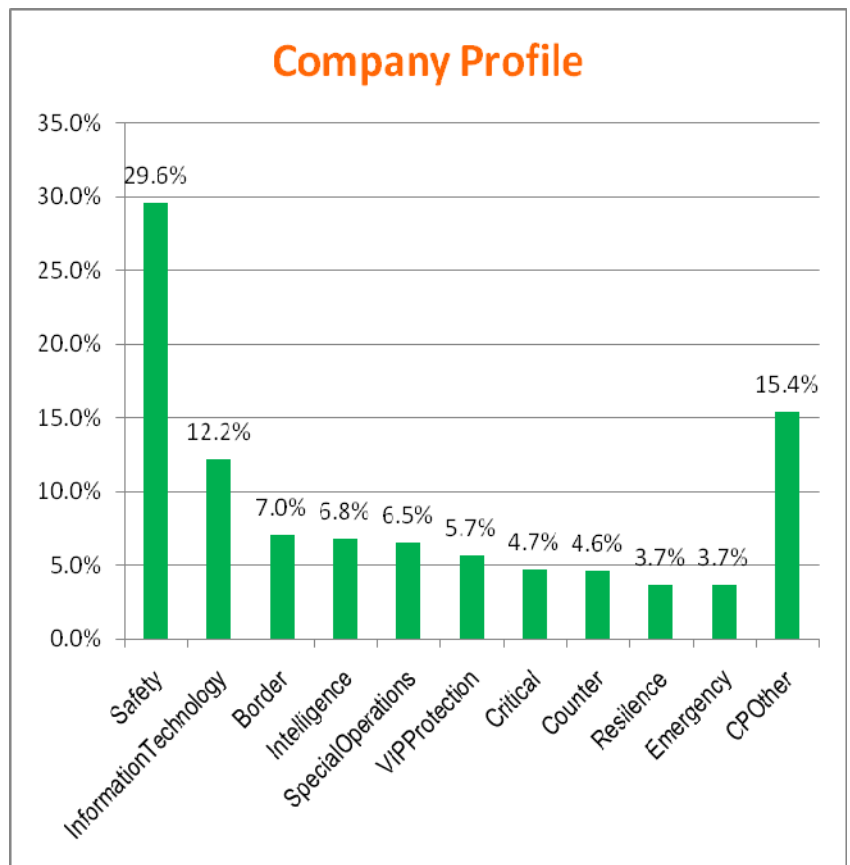

Top firms eye region's Dh11bn security market

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Global security firms will vie for a slice of the Middle East's Dh11.8 billion homeland security market through their participation at Abu Dhabi's biannual security show.

The International Security and National Resilience (ISNR) Abu Dhabi will be the Middle East's first event focused exclusively on homeland security. The four-day exhibition and conference will be held at Abu Dhabi International Exhibition Centre from March 2 next year.

A study commissioned by Reed Exhibitions, one of the event's organisers, has found

that the region's security market will be worth Dh7.7bn next year and will grow more than 50 per cent to reach Dh11.8bn in 2013. In 1998, security spending in the region was just over Dh2.9bn.

global security companies has been outstanding. Our participants value the unrivalled platform the show provides in the region," said Mohammed Nabhani, show director.

Leading firms that have confirmed their participation include EADS, Thales, Sagem, Allen-Vanguard, Britten-Norman, Plextek and Honeywell. The Ministry of Interior is expected to host official delegations led by top security officials from more than 33 countries at the show.

Conference topics will include issues such as early warning and defence preparedness, building defences against catastrophic events and infrastructure protection.

Middle growth East's homeland security sector entering sustained phase

EADS, Thales, BAE Systems, IBCOL, SAGEM, CARACAL and Honeywell are among several world leading players from the defence and security industries who have already confirmed their participation at ISNR Abu Dhabi, in a bid to tap the Middle East's expanding market potential.

In response to requests by exhibitors to streamline the region's security events calendar, ISNR will incorporate the former Security and Safety Middle East, Infosecurity and APTS (Airport, Port & Transport Security) Middle East exhibitions.

Stating that Abu Dhabi was the ideal choice for the first edition of ISNR in the Middle East as it served as a gateway to a high potential region, Rear Admiral John Tolhurst, Chairman of Reed Exhibitions Aerospace & Defence Board said that there was a fast-growing awareness in the region on the need for up-to-date security and safety systems.
